The registration of the HAZA-TALAL Refugee Support Foundation by the Miskolc General Court was carried out on 8 June 2022, at the request of the founder Zoltán Kiss, on the basis of the decision No. 15.Pk.60.070/2022/3.

Classification of the foundation according to its purpose: social activity

Our Objective:

To promote the social, cultural and social integration of persons arriving in Hungary, in particular those who have been forced to leave their country of origin because of war or other conflicts, persons in need of international protection (applicants, refugees, asylum seekers, persons granted asylum, stateless persons, persons granted protection) and their family members through targeted programmes, and to protect their rights in the official procedure and in public services.

To this end, various training courses are organised with the help of health professionals, mental health professionals, psychologists, coaches, teachers and language teachers.

Facilitating the creation of the conditions necessary for the preservation of human dignity for the persons concerned along the migration routes, providing them with various material means and conditions, information on the characteristics of the journey ahead and the conditions to be expected at their destination.

Helping refugees to return either to their country of origin or to the country of destination of their choice, with a view to reuniting families.

The Foundation is represented by Dr. Krisztina Kárászi, Curator.

A few sentences about our activities in 2023:

After the preparations of the previous year, 2023 has already started with several programmes and project ideas. The year started with networking and the development of the social networking sites.

The Foundation took an active part in supporting the Hungarian-Ukrainian border areas, providing basic needs to people who were displaced from their homes by the war conflict. Thus, at the beginning of the year, donations were sent to the Baptist Relief Service in Tiszabec and the Maltese Relief Service in Beregsurany.

The main focus this year was on Ukrainian children and their integration. This remains our goal, but our organisation's credo also goes beyond the humanitarian crisis of the war in Ukraine.

Throughout the year we have also received various requests for assistance from civilians:

First, we supported a mother who had fled from Kharkiv, and then a disabled lady from Donbass contacted the Foundation. We tried to respond to their requests, involving other non-profit organisations. We prepared durable and dry food and hygiene kits for them.

We also helped two Ukrainian men with their housing difficulties. We financed their continued stay in temporary accommodation and provided them with basic food packages.

We have also been active in local integration and community building:

In the spring, we had the opportunity to participate in a joint grant programme between OTP Bank and the Humanity Social Foundation. In collaboration with the OTP volunteer team, we shared the determination to make the time spent by the most vulnerable, children in Hungary, even if only for a short period, meaningful and enriching. Therefore, we organised a full-day youth programme for 44 Ukrainian children at the FUTURA Experience Centre in Mosonmagyaróvár, where they were introduced to the world of science through science experiments and playful learning.

With the onset of autumn, we organised a youth and sports camp in Tiszabec at the Vidám Dölgfín Campsite on the banks of the wild Tisza River. The two-day camp was attended by 12 young people from Transcarpathia/Ukraine. During the camp the children had the opportunity to try their hand at various sports, including canoeing and adventure sports. Due to the success of the camp, we plan to make this programme a recurring feature of our Foundation.

In addition to camping, we also made time to donate. We visited the Beregsurány help centre, where we reminisced about the previous year with the well-known staff of the Hungarian Maltese Relief Service and handed over our aid packages. The donations included mainly food and some clothes.

As the festive season approached, we started to organise Santa Claus activities. The Foundation organised a Santa Claus Day for 22 young people in Győr.

Afterwards, we presented needy, refugee young people and children with Santa Claus packages. In Veszprém. In support of the work of the DNIPRO OUKE Association, we put

together 27 Santa Claus Day gift packages, which were donated to children from the Ukrainian community in Veszprém.

In cooperation with the Kalunba Nonprofit Ltd., we supported a Pravoslavic Santa Claus evening on 19 December in the café "Nem Adom Fel" (I will not give up), where we presented gift packages to the children.

Our foundation plans to expand its network of contacts and to involve volunteers to help refugees in our country and abroad even more effectively.
